**TA SELECTION GUIDELINES** 

- FHL instructors need a Teaching Assistant (TA) who can contribute intellectually as well as be "hands on" help for FHL courses. FHL policy is that UW graduate students who are qualified have priority over non-UW students for FHL courses, even though we recognize that all TAs actively learn while teaching.
- Students who have an active research program at FHL, or who wish to start one, will be given priority over those whose research will not benefit from being at FHL.
- Priority will be given to students of faculty members engaged, or interested in becoming engaged, in research at FHL; we want our research community to expand, and bringing in new students as TAs may be an indirect way to bring in new faculty and establish interdisciplinary collaborations.
- Students who have already TA'ed the same FHL course 3 or more times will be given lower priority than other (qualified) students. While it is helpful for instructors to have highly experienced TAs, other students deserve the opportunity to get this training, which is important for their careers.
- Students who have TA'ed at FHL for four consecutive years get lower priority than relatively new graduate students.
